Sarah welcomed members to the meeting

The speaker could not start her talk till 20.30 so the order of tonight's programme was reversed with business and breakout groups first and then the talk.

Update from special interest groups.

Gardening group - Janet Bickford has organised three trips this year and although members said that they preferred weekends for the visits the turnout for the week day one was much better. She has more gardens lined up to visit which need pre-booking so she will send out details. It includes the Hannah Peschar Sculpture Garden in Dorking (dry weather needed) and Painshill Park on the National Garden 2for1 scheme and a Vineyard on 25th July.

Members were then put in breakout rooms to socialize for 10 minutes before welcoming our speaker Sian Fox.

Sarah Introduced Sian Fox who spoke to "It shouldn't happen to a Home Economist but it has". In her words "My talk is a light-hearted canter through my always varied and sometimes daft career as a Home Economist."

At the age of 14 years old when school Sian was transferred from the Latin class to join her friends in the domestic science class her grandmother re-assured her that any woman who could cook would be appreciated. She enjoyed the subject and went on to study it at University where it was a scientific degree rather than a practical course at the same college that Mary Berry had attended.

After graduating she went on to work at The Trading Standards Office and then after a career break to work for Sainsburys Food Advisory team where she stayed for 23 years. This started out giving out the test samples in store through to helping GP surgeries giving dietary advice to taking part in the Sainsbury sponsored MEND scheme and Jamie Oliver's school meals campaign. She is now giving talks to groups such as the WI and working on demonstration stands at large shows for kitchen equipment manufacturers. So although she was not able to study Latin at school the knowledge that she gained in her home economic lessons at school then at University came in very useful – just as her grandmother had said.

Joint President Sarah Minister thanked Sian for her illuminating talk and members had an opportunity to ask questions.
